- Schuylkill Navy medals will be awarded to first intermediate, light intermediate, lightweight, senior and open in mens and womens single races.
- All masters events are 2000 meters. Only the disabled doubles and novice singles will race 1000 meters.
- The regatta start time is 9:00 a.m. The order of events is fixed and will not be changed. Heats, if required, will start at 9:00 a.m. and be run before the first final in the same order as the finals. In 2004, we had 18 heats before beginning finals at 10:34.
- Weigh-ins will be from 7:00 to 9:00 a.m. at #4. Lightweight men - 160 max, no averaging. Lightweight women - 130 max, no averaging. Same for masters.
- Competitors provide their own bow numbers. Bow numbers will be on sale during racing at the Canoe Club, \$12 for a set of six.
- Novice = never raced sweep or sculling before January 1, 2005.
- All entries must be entered on-line at Regatta Central by Thursday, June 9. No paper entries.
- Entry fees: Singles \$20.00, Doubles & Pairs, \$35.00, Quads & Fours \$50.00, Eights \$60.00.
